It takes scores of participants to make an event as big as the Epiphany Celebration a success. This year, our supporters started with a fast-paced work party on Saturday, January 4th. In just a few hours they had sorted and boxed up hundreds of shoes for the event.

The next day, over 60 volunteers traveled to the Galilee Center in Coachella to give migrant workers 2,250 pairs of new shoes for their children as well as other donated gifts like warm blankets. More than 1,500 needy families from the area attended. The celebration began with singing and a procession led by the Three Kings. The Magi (shown above) traveled with us on the bus and looked suspiciously familiar but they set the tone for a day of solidarity. We got a chance to actually meet the families we were trying to help and interact with them.

We want to express our heartfelt thanks to the donors in the parish who contributed so generously to this event and all who participated in it.

# New Computers At Casa Eudes Will Help Students Keep Up

We're in the process of upgrading both the internet connection and the computers the girls use to do their homework. The current machines are so outmoded, the tech people helping us joke that they can only be recycled as doorstops or boat anchors. When the new system is in place, the girls will find it much easier to do their homework. There are just a few old computers now and the connection is so slow, the girls often have to stay up late to finish their assignments.





### "Recycled" Donation Shed Going Up

Our donation program has been given some big items in the past but we recently received a whole building! Well, OK. It's actually just a one-room structure that Habitat for Humanity could no longer use but it will make a perfect storage shed for To take advantage of this sudden windfall, a crew of us. volunteers tore the structure down and transported it to the lower church parking lot in the truck we use for pick-ups. Now we're waiting for the parish administrators to decide on the exact spot to reconstruct it. Once that happens, our helpers will have a "shed raising" party. We have two other sheds our donations program is using at the moment to store donated food, clothing and household goods. One of them has just about lost its battle with termites and old age. This new, recycled building will be a much studier and roomier replacement.

### Put Your Talents To Work To Help The Poor

Here's your chance to use your skills to improve the lives of others. Most of these Mission Circle jobs take just a few hours a week: Website Manager -- update event information, photos, and the

calendar. Takes about two hours a month plus attending a monthly Mission Circle meeting.

**Mission Circle Secretary** -- take notes during our meetings once a month and submit a report. Update member information. About an hour a week.

**Organizer For Our Donation Program** -- schedule local food pick ups for and its distribution to soup kitchens in the area. Organize the donations of clothes and household goods. Takes about one hour a week -- mostly phone work.

**Maintenance Person For Our Donation Sheds** -- make sure the grounds and the donations sheds are clean and the bread and donations are stored efficiently. Enough strength is needed to move and lift up to 50 pounds. Requires about two hours a week.

Youth Outreach Contact -- serve as a liaison between young adults, young families, and teens in the parish. Promote and encourage their participation in our Mission Circle events. Estimated time about one hour a week.

#### **News Briefs:**

**Filling Holiday Baskets** -- Mission Circle volunteers participated in a Community Resource Center event held at the Fairgrounds on December 20th. Our workers helped hundreds of poor families select food, clothing, household goods, and toys to brighten their holiday.

**Booking Dinners For The Homeless** -- different groups in the parish continue to prepare dinners and serve them to the homeless at The Bread Of Life Mission in Oceanside

**Tutoring Students** -- twice a week after school volunteers from the parish give some students at St. Leo's a little one-on-one help with their homework. The kids often come from Spanish speaking households and need a bit of coaching to keep up in school.

**Offering Shelter To The Homeless** -- for two weeks in January the parish hall was home to nine homeless families participating in the Interfaith Shelter Network. Every year in the winter, along with 115 other faith communities in the San Diego area, we temporarily house and feed people who had "no place to lay their heads". Some parish volunteers provide meals while others stay overnight in the hall to provide companionship and encouragement.
