Volunteer To Help Close To Home ..

If you're busy with work and family, it's hard to find time to help the poor. That's why we offer so many programs that are close to home and require just an hour or two to participate. Your kids are welcome to help at most of these activities. Check our website for "kid friendly" events. It's a wonderful way to teach compassion.

<u>3rd Parish Food Packaging Event</u> On Sunday, October 12, we're going to hold our third food packaging event to help the hungry locally as well as in places like the Dominican Republic. The whole parish will help pack non-perishable meals that are nutritionally balanced and cost just pennies each. Because packaging takes very little work, many meals can be packaged in just a few hours. If you'd like to join us, please contact Bob Giese at giesemail@san.rr.com.

The Tutoring Program is conducted after school at St. Leo's twice a week. Homework coaches give young kids who come from Spanish speaking households a little one-on-one help with their homework. Recently we added a pre-school program to give the kindergarten kids a head start before they enter first grade. This tutoring just takes 1 1/2 hours a week and it doesn't require any special training. We need volunteers to sign up every school term.

Dinners For The Homeless at the Bread of Life Mission in Oceanside. Parishioners who like to cook put their culinary skills to work to provide a dinner for people who are homeless. On a designated day, a crew of volunteer "chefs" will shop for the ingredients, prepare the dinner in the parish kitchen, and then take it up to Oceanside and serve it to the street people at the mission. If you can take the time to travel a bit, there are several other ways to help the poor. While most of our activities are close by, here are a few that require short trips to Coachella to help migrant families or Tijuana to help "at risk" girls:

Support For The Casa Eudes Girls Home in Tijuana is our first priority and has been for almost 40 years. These are kids who have been mistreated or come from homes that are so poor their parents can't afford to raise them. We provide food and shelter and pay for their education. This year, we updated all the computers as well as the internet connection to help the kids keep up in school.

<u>Casa Eudes Crafts, Parties & Fun Events</u> We love to plan fun times for these girls who have had so few of them in their lives. Once or twice a month our volunteers go down to the home to do craft projects with the kids. Last year we started a sewing program to teach the girls this useful skill. In December, we host a big Christmas party with a visit from Santa. We also plan day trips for the girls and help them stage a fashion show with donated clothes from the parish in the Spring. To help with these activities, you'll need a special Passport Card to speed up reentry into the United States. For details, contact Vreni Crimmins at <u>vrenicrim@aol.com</u>. <u>Casa Eudes Maintenance</u> A small crew goes down to Tijuana two Saturdays a month to keep the girls' home in good working order and make improvements. If you're handy with tools, you might enjoy going down to help on these weekends. Don't worry about your skill level. Many jobs don't take a lot of experience and we can always use another pair of hands. To join us, you'll need a special Passport Card to speed up reentry to the US. The Epiphany Celebration is a annual event that's held to provide useful gifts to a poor community. Parishioners donate the items we supply. Once again this year the Celebration was held at the Galilee Center in Coachella where many migrant families live. The average income for these needy families is only about \$10,000 a year. Mission Circle supporters, the Youth Group, and Just Faith members went to this area on Sunday, January 5th, to give new shoes to hundreds of kids and warm blankets to their families. The Galilee Center contributed non-perishable food and gently used clothing. You're welcome to join us next year in early January. Peanut butter sandwiches for inmates in the TJ jail: For some time a small crew of ladies from St. Leo's has been making hundreds of sandwiches for a volunteer to take to the hungry prisoners in the Tijuana jail. They stayed to make sandwiches and they've been coming ever since with several others from their mission program. We're proud to help supply the peanut butter and jelly for this unusual ministry. Sheltering the homeless: Working together with 115 faith communities in San Diego, we open our parish hall doors to homeless individuals and families for two weeks each year. Since 1986, our parish has hosted over 300 persons who temporarily had "no place to lay their head". Many of these people are families with children.
