We Came Bearing Gifts For Hundreds Of Migrant Families


It rained on Sunday, January 11th, but nothing could put a damper on our Epiphany Celebration! We traveled to The Galilee Center in Coachella to give migrant families warm blankets to keep away the cold as well as new shoes and socks for their children. The center added food including fresh produce and canned goods.

The event actually started the day before with scores of St. James parishioners and other volunteers sorting and packaging all the shoes and socks to transport to the center.

Mission Circle supplied more than 1,600 pairs of shoes and over 60 of our supporters made the six-hour round trip to help distribute them. The three wise men left their camels behind and traveled with us on the bus to mingle with the crowd and remind us of the meaning of the day: to bring gifts to ease the lives of these very poor families who make less than \$10,000 a year picking crops. This year has been extra hard for them because the drought has reduced the crops and cut down on the available work.

Some volunteers stocked the tables while others acted as escorts, helping each family find shoes that fit their kids and making sure they had blankets and food to take home.

Mission Circle would like to thank everyone who helped make this Epiphany Celebration so meaningful. We actually got a chance to meet the people we are trying to help. Despite the rain, it was a wonderful, heart-warming day.



Help Fund Life-Changing Scholarships For Casa Eudes Girls

When a girl is old enough to leave the Casa Eudes Girls Home (the home for "at risk" kids that we help support in Tijuana), she is completely on her own. She usually has no family to help her so going to college is an impossible dream. She has to accept a lowpaying job with no chance to get ahead.

Our new Futures Program will change all that. We hope to offer qualified high school seniors from Casa Eudes life-changing scholarships to study the field of their choice at a Tijuana college.

To prepare the girls for this opportunity, there are new skills that will be taught at the Casa Eudes Girls Home itself. The juniors and seniors in high school will receive instruction and mentoring in subjects such as computer programs and English courses to help them prepare for college or vocational training.

Right now there are three Casa Eudes girls that started college in Tijuana this term with our help. We need sponsors and mentors for them so they can continue their studies.
