Our Parish Packaged 77,600 Meals To Help The Hungry

On Oct. 9, volunteers in the parish hall set a record for packaging meals -- 77,600 were packed in just 3 hours! The 650 participants at our 5th annual food packaged event worked at a fevered pace because the meals were going to Haiti -- a third world country that had just been ravished by a terrible hurricane. And there was a personal urgency to help from students at Cathedral Catholic High School who had recently visited an orphanage in Les Cayes that was reported to be devastated by the storm. The students and their families raised enough money to pay for 21,000 extra meals and came to the event to package them. Many other outreach groups helped with the event including the youth groups from St. James and St. Leo's, and even other churches like Calgary Lutheran and Encinitas Church of Christ. Guests of honors were three refugees from Haiti who thanked the volunteers sincerely for their compassion efforts. Once again, a charity called Friends and Family Connections helped us stage this parish-wide effort and made sure the boxes of food reached their intended destination. We thank everyone who helped with this compassionate event.

Parishioners Join "Shoes To The World" On A Trip To Columbia

In lots of poor places in the world, children go without shoes. This is not just uncomfortable — it can be dangerous to their health. That's because there are parasites in the soil that bore through the soles of bare feet and cause serious health problems. A local organization called "Shoes To The World" is working to combat this serious situation. This charity, based in St. Patrick's in Encinitas, distributes shoes to children in poor areas of the world and it has grown quickly. Now Mission Circle is making plans to partner with this outreach program to expand our own efforts to provide shoes to needy kids. Several of our members recently went on a fact-finding trip to Columbia to distribute shoes and see how "Shoes To The World" operates. News Briefs:

Parish Hall Sheltered The Homeless from Oct. 23 to Nov. 6, offering food and place to stay to some of the homeless in our community. Other local churches are doing the same, scheduling the two-week visits through the North Coast Interfaith Shelter Network. During the time the homeless stayed in our parish hall, volunteers provided meals, transportation, and help with laundry. Parishioners also stayed overnight with these destitute people who so desperately need our support.

Homemade Cookies Gave Prisoners A Break last month. Over 400 dozen delicious, homemade cookies were donated by the St. James parish through our Kairos prison ministry on Oct. 22 and 23. The cookie collection is all part of a much larger interfaith effort to offer homemade treats to the prisoners one weekend at the R.J. Donovan Correctional Institution Facility in Otay Mesa. The cookies are wildly popular with the inmates and help encourage their participation in the ministry weekend.
